Will Month Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is Will Month?

Will Month is an annual event in October where local solicitors donate their time and expertise to write or update Wills in exchange for a donation to East Cheshire Hospice, instead of their usual fees.

2. Where can I find the list of participating solicitors?

3. How do I book an appointment?

To book an appointment, contact your chosen solicitor directly. They will schedule a date and time for you in October.

4. Where will the appointment take place?

Appointments will be held at the solicitors' offices listed on our website. Some solicitors may also offer online video or phone appointments.

5. What services will the solicitor provide?

Participating solicitors will write a single or mirror Will, or update your current Will, in exchange for a donation to the Hospice. Additional services will incur the solicitors' standard fees.

6. How much should I donate?

During your appointment booking, your solicitor will suggest a donation amount equivalent to their usual fees. Remember, the solicitors are donating their time to support the Hospice.

7. How do I make my donation?

Your solicitor will provide you with an East Cheshire Hospice donation envelope at your appointment. Donations can also be made via card or Apple/Google Pay using a QR code. Please bring your cash or cheque to your initial appointment if you wish to donate in this way.

8. What if the solicitor I want is fully booked?

Contact our Individual Giving Fundraising Manager, Beth, at 01625 708934 and she will help you find an alternative solicitor. Early booking is recommended.

9. Where does my donation go?

All donations made during Will Month go directly to East Cheshire Hospice. The Hospice relies on community support to fundraise £9,362 every single day in order to provide vital care to those in need, free of charge. Rest assured that your donation makes a significant impact on our patients and their families.
